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Night Work to Occur in the Intersection of Moulton and Ridge Route as Recycled Water Expansion Project Continues

Lake Forest, CA – As part of El Toro Water District's Recycled Water Expansion Project, night work will soon begin in the intersection of Moulton Parkway and Ridge Route Drive. At least one lane will be open in each direction at all times and access to the adjacent shopping centers will be maintained.

On Sunday, April 21 from 8:00 p.m. until approximately 6:00 a.m. construction crews will begin to install pipeline in the intersection. Given the volume of traffic that flows through this intersection, the work is being done at night to try to minimize any inconvenience.

Night work is expected to continue on Monday, April 22 through Thursday, April 25 between 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. No night work will take place on Friday, April 26 or Saturday, April 27. However, it is possible that an addition night of work will occur on Sunday, April 28.

The Recycled Water Expansion Project will increase the amount of recycled water produced for local irrigation from 500 acre foot per year (AFY) to 1400 AFY. By producing more recycled water, the District will save precious imported drinking water (potable) for household consumption and sanitary uses.
