UNDERSTANDING THE 2025 PROP 218 RATE NOTICE WHAT ETWD CUSTOMERS NEED TO KNOW

As caretakers of our community's water resources, El Toro Water District is dedicated to maintaining transparency and accountability in every aspect of our operations, including how we set rates. In compliance with Proposition 218, the District is providing our customers with information about proposed changes to the District's water, sewer and recycled water rates and charges, expected to take effect on July 1, 2025.

Investing in Water Reliability

Every year, the District's Board of Directors adopts an annual operating budget. Part of the budgeting process is to assess the adequacy of the District's rates and charges. The integrity and reliability of the District's infrastructure and the District's financial stability are of utmost importance. To assist the District in this process, the District retains an independent outside financial consultant who developed a Cost of Service Study, which can be found at www.ETWD.com, under the Governance tab.

ETWD is committed to providing you with reliable and sustainable water, sewer and recycled water services. The proposed rate increases are necessary to cover the increased costs of purchased water while maintaining the integrity of our infrastructure and ensuring financial stability. The proposed rate increases to support the cost of operations are due to the following cost drivers:



ETWD Xpress Bill Pay Fee Changes

ETWD uses Xpress Bill Pay, a third-party payment service, for customers who elect to pay their bill online or via an automated or operator assisted phone system. Beginning May 19, 2025, Xpress Bill Pay fees associated with ETWD online and phone bill payments will be changing.

These fee changes will apply to all payments (including autopay) using a credit card, debit card or electronic check through Xpress Bill Pay. Additionally, there will be a \$500 per transaction limit on credit and debit card payments. Any customers that are enrolled in auto pay directly through ETWD are not affected by this change. Summer rebate season is here! Apply for a rebate today to fund improvements that can save you money and water all year long. Ride the wave of savings with the indoor and outdoor rebates for ETWD customers listed below.

Residential Indoor Rebates

PROGRAM/DEVICE	REBATE LEVEL
High Efficiency Clothes Washers	Up to \$200
Premium High Efficiency Toilets (4-Liter) Replace existing 1.6 gpf toilets with a 1.1 gpf or less toilet.	Up to \$100 per toilet

Residential Outdoor Rebates

PROGRAM/DEVICE	REBATE LEVEL
Weather Based Smart Sprinkler Timer	Up to \$250
Soil Moisture Sensor Controller	Up to \$150
Rotating Sprinkler Nozzles	Up to \$2 per nozzle (min. 15)
Drip Irrigation	\$0.75 sq. ft. up to 5,000 sq. ft.
Rain Barrels and Cisterns	Up to \$50 per rain barrel and \$250 – \$350 per cistern
Turf Removal	\$4 sq. ft. up to 5,000 sq. ft. (annual maximum)*

*Turf rebates do not apply to designated recycled water sites. If you have already removed your turf, your project is not eligible for this program. Additionally, projects must not be started prior to the receipt and acknowledgment of this Program's Letter to Proceed.

2025 WATER QUALITY REPORT



At ETWD, we're committed to providing you and your family with safe, high-quality drinking water 24/7. We're proud to report that, as always, your water meets or exceeds all federal and state standards.

You can read detailed information about your water in our latest Annual Water Quality Report. The report includes the results of rigorous water quality testing that we conducted during the previous calendar year. It outlines where your water comes from, what it contains, and how it compares to the standards set by the U.S. EPA and the State Water Resources Control

Board. Customers will receive a printed copy of the report by July 1, and an electronic copy will be available on ETWD's website on June 1.

To test your water quality, ETWD employees perform more than 12,000 tests every year, drawing samples from 70 locations across our service area. We also operate a high-tech water quality laboratory that's certified by the California Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program.
